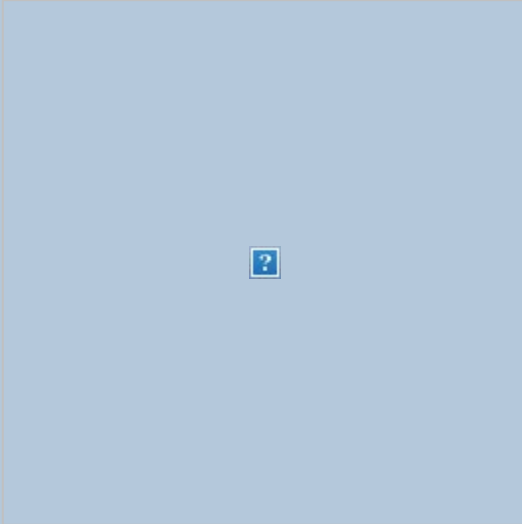

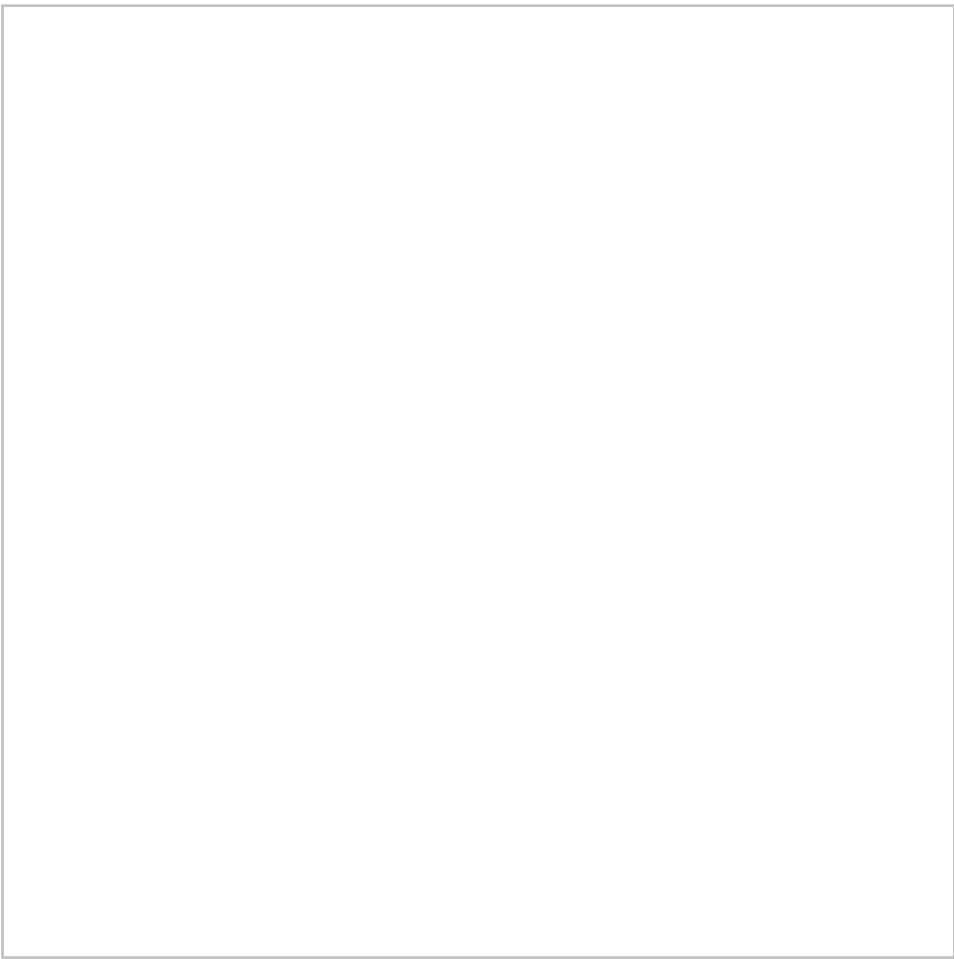

Painting & Drawing Open Studio

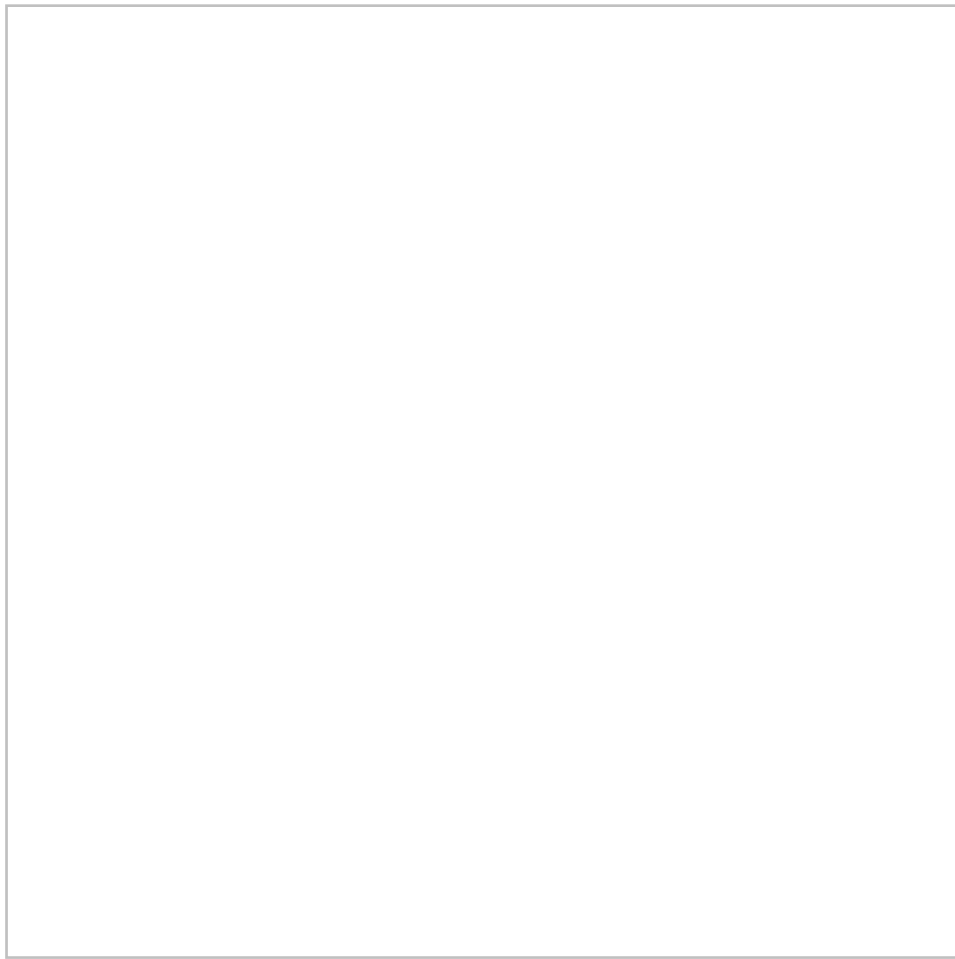

An Exhibition exploring organic forms with individual media.

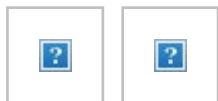
